Commissioner Sliwinski said while driving he noticed a vehicle broken down on the road. Fire Engine #4 pulled over and helped push the person's car to safety. He said it was great to see the attributes that make Wake Forest wonderful. He thanked the firefighters and Chief Early for creating that culture of service in the Town's Fire Department.

Commissioner Clapsaddle congratulated staff who completed the 2024 Effective Supervisory Practices course. He shared that the Wake Forest Purple Heart Foundation Dinner will be held on August 3rd and the Flag Raising Ceremony will be held on August 5th. He also mentioned if you haven't seen Questions with Kiel Ortiz you need to watch it on the Town's Facebook page. He said it's informative and enjoyable to watch.

Commissioner Cross attended the July 4th Events. She and Mayor Jones met with Wake County Public Schools representatives to talk about future information sharing and collaboration. Commissioner Cross thanked those who are choosing to come and speak during public comment. She thinks it shows commitment and concern by residents and stakeholders when they choose to show up and speak time and again.

Commissioner Shackleford explained that a permit for the PRIDE Festival was properly issued and met the requirements and would not make a motion nor second a motion and would not vote for a motion to remove a permit that's been properly approved.

She shared that Ann Welton will help work on an Assessment Program.
